Click on File→ Save. A new window will open that allows you to specify the file format. Call the file "faded.edges".

	Step 6 Copy the photo into your new image.
<image/>	 How to do it: Keep the file called faded-edges.psp open. Open the photo from this tutorial Click in the title bar of the photo to make sure it is the active image. In the menu choose Edit Copy A copy of the photo has now been placed on your computer's clipboard. Click on the title bar of the image called faded-edges to make it the active image. In the menu choose Edit Paste As a new selection. The photo will be copied to exactly the center of your new image. Do not move the mouse (it will move the position of the image). Click once to anchor the photo on the new image. The photo will be copied as a floating selection. Defloat it by choosing from the menu Selections Defloat.
	 *<u>Step 7</u> – Choose area to keep sharp. From the menu choose Selections Modify Contract. A window will open asking how much to contract by. Choose 10. The marquee will move inside the photo.
	 *Step 8 – Choose the area to fade out. From the menu choose Selections Modify Feather. A window will open asking how much to feather by. Choose 10. The marquee will grow by 10 pixels. From the menu choose Selections Invert. The marquee will change to form a frame around your photo. Inside the frame will stay sharp. In the border will be the fade.

• •	 tep 9 – Make it fade! Press the delete key. The edges will fade. To get more of a faded edge, press the delete key several times.
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
