## Gill named teacher of year as 97 graduate; he talks of most vs. moment

Physical-education instructor Brian Gill was chosen as teacher of the year by the Class of 2007 and spoke briefly on June 9 as 97 seniors graduated.

Gill talked about the value of coaching teaching winning and losing. "I want to teach you how to have a life of play," said Gill in accepting the award. "Because there is no higher calling than that."

He called it a "great privilege" to have taught some members of the class for six years and to serve them.

"Like the teachers you see in front of you here, many of the hours of service and the acts of service you've seen, and many you'll never know about."

He said he had some words of wisdom for the class. "The reason most people fail instead of succeed is they trade what they want most for what they want at

the moment," said Gill. "... If you do that, you're going to be successful. You may not always be happy, but you'll be content and be productive and you'll live lives worthy of emulating, and I hope you'll live lives of play. ## White quits school board, seeks parent to replace her

Mount Greylock School Committee member Sarah B. "Sally" White is resigning early from the board effective June 25, saying she thinks her replacement should have a child at the school. Her term expires in Nov., 2008.

In a resignation letter delivered this week to school and Williamstown officials, White said it's time, after four years, for a "fresh person" to replace her "who will bring new ideas and perspectives to the group." The seven-member school board includes four members elected from Williamstown and three from Lanesborough.

Under state law, Williamstown selectmen will vote to appoint a successor to fill White's unexpired term.

White, who's daughter Lucy is a graduating senior, said she realized that starting in September, none of the present four Williamstown members on the board will have a student at the school. "I think it is important that, when they sit down to deliberate, the committee has some members who are familiar with the school from a parent's perspective.

White, in her statement, says she has enjoyed her years of service getting to know and work with students, faculty and parents from Lanesborough and Williamstown. She urged community members to consider running for school-committee positions in the November, 2008 election.

White was the only school board member to vote against the school's current-year budget, saying a Proposition 2-1/2 override was needed. In a written statement released in March, she decried the steady erosion of the school's budget over five budget cycles.

"This budget does not meet the school's needs now or for the future," she said in the statement, adding: "If public education is a hallmark of our democracy, then let us stand up and peak up and say, as citizens, that we care about public education, that we care about our children, and that we will pay to provide an education, a good education, for each and every one of them."

White wrote that MGRHS will no longer be known for its excellence and program richness, but for large class sizes and reduced elective choices because adults in the community fails to support adequate public secondary education.

She wrote: "These students are watching multi-million-dollar buildings being constructed and multi-million-dollar homes being bought and sold in their communities, yet they fear that they might not be able to take a foreign language, or participate in a school play, not because our communities are too poor to fund public education, but because the taxpayers are not being told what the real costs of doing so are. Will our comfortable citizens feel contented living in pleasant, scenic surroundings while local children attend a Spartan high school that offers limited academic choices and extracurricular activities? Is that the kind of community we want to be?"
